Two worlds collide when unexpected guests arrive at Mia's house party and she watches the night spiral out of control, caught in the crossfire of ignorance under the influence.


SYNOPSIS

- 65 words -

When Youssef, Nizar, and Elias discover Mia and her friends playing the German drinking game, Flunky Ball, Youssef insists on trying his luck. Upon making the winning shot, the two groups of strangers merge enthusiastically for a fun night in the German countryside.

As the night wares on, the groups' worst fears are realized in a painful portrayal of the consequences of internalized and systemic racism.

CREATIVE STATEMENT


Good intentions do not always result in positive outcomes (intention \neq impact). The only action possibly more dangerous than overt racism is the inaction in apathy and complacency. *Flunkyball* explores whiteness and the bystander effect in a wrought depiction of internalized and systemic racism.

This film is meant to combine a naturalistic, handheld shooting approach with curiously foreboding and surrealist undertones. Inspiration for visual style came from Sean Price Williams' work on *Good Time* and Reed Morano's in *Meadowland* and *The Handmaid's Tale*. As for score and sound design, I am inspired by Mac Quayle's work on *Mr. Robot* and Mark H. Phillip's score in *Homecoming*.

I worked collaboratively with the cast and crew to develop a script in two languages I don't speak: Arabic and German. One of the highlights in prepro was improvising and devising with the actors to develop the first scene of the film. I think the challenge of directing In languages I don't speak made me aware of the importance of telling stories responsibly and always remaining open for critique. As a white woman, working on this film has only further proven how important continued learning/unlearning is in the journey towards anti-racism.

My hope is that this will give an opportunity for reflection and discussion around racism and risk for white people versus POC.

Lisa is a German stage director and film actress who recently completed her B.A. at University of Vienna in Theatre, Film & Media studies and English & American Studies. Lisa is in grad school for her M.A. in Arts Administration and Directing and the founder and CEO of her company, <u>Wiener Spielwut</u>, Lisa has directed various theatre projects including *Regained Paradise Lost, Bel Ami*, and *Concerning Mars*, which was part of the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. She has worked on various independent films as an actor and producer in Austria and Germany such as *Philomena* (2016), *Stark im Kommen* (2017 TV Show Pilot) and *Terra Nullius* (2019).

Mohammed Alshaneif is an actor and writer from Damascus, Syria. Mohammed started acting in plays after moving from Syria to Egypt at the age of 15. Since arriving in the United States in 2017, Mohammed has continued his journey as a stage actor in addition to stepping into the film world. Since 2017 Mohammed has written and acted in more than 15 short films including *Driver*, winner of Scout Film Festival's Emerging Filmmakers Grant, which he wrote and starred in. His most recent role is as Youssef in the upcoming short film *Flunkyball* directed by Tess Forestieri.

Noor, who is proudly queer and Syrian-American, is a New York based actor, teacher, dialect coach and circus artist. Noor moved to New York from Chicago many years ago to train at the William Esper Studio, where he honed and further developed his craft. He's appeared in various theatre productions Off-Broadway (including "Cartography" by Kaneza Schaal and Chris Myers), locally, regionally, internationally, and, due to the pandemic, on Zoom.
